To add a visualization to a dashboard, select the pin icon. Because we're creating a new dashboard, select the option for New dashboard and give it a name. When you select Pin, Power BI creates the new dashboard in the current workspace. After the Pinned to dashboard message appears, select Go to dashboard.
